Foreword

On behalf of Child Friendly Nottingham (CFN), I am delighted to present the findings from our first Child Friendly Nottingham Children & Young People's Survey.

The survey is the outcome of a collaboration between members of the CFN Co-operation & Leadership Group. Analysis has been led by Nottingham City Council's Research, Engagement & Consultation Team together with the University of Nottingham's City as Lab.

Over a thousand children and young people answered a wide range of questions. Thank you to everbody who responded, as well as to the teachers, youth & play workers, and other professionals who supported children and young people to participate.

This is the first survey of its kind in the city. In addition to providing insight about the lived experiences of the respondents, we are also learning about what worked well with the survey and what didn't, refining the approach so that we can grow and diversify participation in future iterations.

The findings are not definitive or a judgment. Instead, they represent the voices and opinions of young citizens, set around the themes of the CFN badge priorities: Safe, Education, Health, and Equal & Included.

We challenge you to use the survey findings to improve the lives of children and young people. The issues identified can help you reassess strategies, prompt further investigation, support research, or underpin project bids. We aim to run this survey annually, supplemented by focused, thematic questionnaires. We are already planning the next survey for autumn 2025. Alongside the findings presented here, this will begin to provide a strong evidence base for partners, researchers, and policymakers. Most importantly, it will enable us to track our progress and report back to children and young people on how their voices are helping to shape a Child Friendly City.

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About the survey

Child Friendly Nottingham (CFN) consulted children and young people living in and around Nottingham between 20 November 2024 and 4 April 2025 via three different surveys: **primary** (ages 7-11), **secondary** (ages 11-16), **further ed/school leaver** (ages 16-18).

The surveys were available in printable and digital versions on the Nottingham City Council Engage Nottingham Hub and the <u>CFN website</u>.

All surveys were anonymous and consent was required. No question was compulsory.

Survey completion numbers:

7-11 survey: 555 11-16 survey: 459 16-18 survey: 108

Total: 1122

Margins of error at 95% confidence rate:

Ages 7-11: 4.09% (based on an estimated population of 17,570) Ages 11-16: 4.52% (based on an estimated population of 19,140) Ages 16-18: 9.38% (based on an estimated population of 10,760)

Participant profile

The spread of living location was:

South Nottingham: 30% of respondents Central Nottingham: 20% of respondents North Nottingham: 50% of respondents

Over fifty different languages were given in response to the question "At home, what language do you speak most of the time?".

Respondents to the 11-16 and 16-18 surveys were asked "Do you have a long-term health problem or disability that limits your day-to-day activities?". Responses were: No (61%), Yes, limited a little (16%), Yes, limited a lot (4%).

















Are you allowed to use the internet at home?




Do you feel safe using the internet?






In a typical week, how often do you get together with friends in person outside of school?




Do you ever play or hang out with your friends after dark?




Do you ever go to a Youth Centre or Activity Centre?




How much money do you have to spend on yourself compared to your friends?







How important is climate change to you?




How happy did you feel yesterday (with 1 being not happy at all and 10 being completely happy)?












Do you use any of these social media platforms?




In a typical week, how often do you get together with friends in person outside of school or work?




How much money do you have to spend on yourself compared to your friends?










