WHAT HAS BEEN HAPPENING?

Nottingham City Council: Executive Board, September meeting reviewed the Chid Friendly Nottingham progress updates from UNICEF UK's (U-UK) assessment after the first 6 monthly U-UK review and the CFN report. See the <u>Exec Board Minutes</u>.

Child Friendly Nottingham Champion Tranai Todd became the youngest person to receive a Nottingham Award at a ceremony at the Nottingham Ice Arena. Since the beginning, Tranai has been involved in Nottingham's work to become a UNICEF UK Child Friendly City. He is a mentor and role model to many and represents everything that is good and positive about young people in the city. At just 20, Tranai is still at the start of his career, but he has already made an indelible





mark. When he was 17 years old, he set up Support Through Sport, an organisation that delivers sports-based interventions to thousands of children and young people across Nottingham and Nottinghamshire.

Creativity Collaboratives Nottingham launched a new Teaching for Creativity Network at the Broadway Cinema recently, showcasing some short films that celebrate the last 3 years of the programme. As part of national programme, supported by the Arts Council and the Freelands Foundation, 12 schools have explored teaching approaches that nurture children's curiosity and creativity. Small Steps Big Changes Early Intervention and Learning Conference – Tuesday 24th and Wednesday 25th September 2024

Small Steps Big Changes (SSBC) recently held a two-day early intervention and learning conference at Trent Vineyard in Nottingham. Small Steps Big Changes is a £45m transformation programme made possible by funding from The National Lottery Community Fund 'A Better Start' ten-year programme. Hosted by Nottingham CityCare, SSBC has been in operation since 2014 and will reach its planned end in March 2025.





The conference was the first in a number of activities and events which will celebrate SSBC and its achievements working with families, babies and young children in Nottingham.

Marking the culmination of almost ten years of using test and learn principles to build evidence and learning from across the programme, this conference provided an opportunity to share key learning, evidence-based approaches, practical strategies and best practice to support speech and language development in young children, encourage strong infant and parental mental health, improve wider public health outcomes through a focus on prevention, grow collaborative practices, and encourage the adoption of father inclusive practice.



More than 300 delegates attended over the two days, with 20+ speakers providing both local and national perspectives, and 17 local community-based organisations in our marketplace all of whom had received funding from the SSBC programme. We were pleased that our conference brought together colleagues from across our partnership with clinicians, early years' leaders, local authorities, commissioners, parents, and community and charitable organisations all with a shared passion for supporting and growing the development of babies and young children, and building capacity within communities and families to support this.

NEXT STEPS

UNICEF UK Review of Child Friendly Nottingham. The Nottingham action plan is now well into its first year of delivery. Every 6 months UNICEF UK conducts a review of the progress we are making. The next review will take place in November 2024. After this review UNICEF UK will provide an assessment of our progress. After our first review in May, U-UK informed us that we are making good progress. We will share this assessment as soon as we are able to,.

CFN Perception Survey

We are approaching the time when our first children and young people's perception survey will go live. The survey is a key action in our Action Plan, and it has been developed by members of the Co-operation and Leadership Badge group as well as through consultation with children and young people. Following final market testing, the survey will go live in early November. It will be supported by practitioner toolkits, to help support children and young people take part, and communications messages to help partners spread the word.

The survey has been designed to be accessible to the widest possible audience. It's split into three age groups: Primary (7-11), Secondary (11-16), and Further Education & Training (16+). The different versions use language and questions appropriate to each cohort. For 0-7s meanwhile, there will be fun, creative activities designed for use by teachers, early years practitioners and carers, to help capture the views and experiences of the young children they work with.

The CFN Perception Survey has been designed to complement other surveys taking place in Nottingham and build upon the base that we currently have. More information will be published soon on the Child Friendly Nottingham website.

Child Friendly Champions. We are encouraging and inviting everyone to become Child Friendly Champions and help to promote children's rights. We believe that the key to our success will come from a collective effort and working together with our amazing partners and





colleagues, agencies, schools, colleges, businesses, community groups, and everyone who makes a difference in the lives of children and young people.
