CHILD RIGHT OF THE MONTH:

In celebration of World Children's Day, this month we are highlighting **Article 45** from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). **World Children's Day** is on **Wednesday 20th November 2024**. Article 45 says that non-government bodies can provide advice and assistance on children's rights.

CFC Shorts 2024

As part of the Child Friendly City partnership and Nottingham's Child Friendly City programme, the UK Committee for UNICEF (UNICEF UK) Child Friendly Cities and Communities (CFC) Team offer monthly webinar series: <u>CFC Shorts</u>.

The CFC Shorts are delivered live online via MS Teams, with a facilitator from the UNICEF UK CFC team, and will include PowerPoint slides and the opportunity for attendees to ask questions and share reflections. These take place on the third Wednesday of every month from 2pm-3pm. Each one-hour session will offer professionals across the CFC network the opportunity to take a deep dive into discrete areas of child's rights-based practice and the CFC programme.

WHAT HAS BEEN HAPPENING?

Primary Parliament 2024-2025

The 2024-2025 Primary Parliament programme began in October with 2.5 days of exciting workshops and presentations delivered in partnership with <u>Nottingham City Council</u>, <u>Ignite</u> and <u>ChalleNGe</u>. A huge thank you goes to <u>YSP Media</u> and students from <u>Nottingham College</u> for all their support in delivering workshops and documenting the sessions.



This term's theme was **Your Voice Matters** and 129 children from 30 Nottingham City schools looked at the importance of sharing their thoughts, opinions and ideas and having their voices heard. Through interactive and creative activities, the Primary Parliamentarians learnt about verbal, written, visual, and digital forms of communication.

During the day, we considered the influence that the Primary Parliamentarians can have on issues at school, in their local community, in the city, across the country and how to effectively be seen, heard and listened to by adults.

With their peers, the children confidently spoke about their thoughts on issues such as climate change, littering, homelessness, and the benefits of outdoor learning. They recorded vox-pop

interviews about why their voice matters. The children created bold visuals in large posters and delivered dramatic performances, which conveyed messages about deforestation, domestic abuse, fairtrade, and better facilities for their local community. They raised questions about how they like to learn, and big issues including racism, bullying, welcoming refugees and what we can do to save the planet.

EQUAL AND INCLUDED, GOLDEN THREAD:



Equal and Included was selected as the Golden thread with our UUK action by the children and young people who took part in our Discovery work. This means that we need to see how children and young people from the diverse communities across the city take part in our children's rights work and our ambition to be a recognised UNICEF Child Friendly City.

WATCH THIS SPACE as the Child Friendly Nottingham Perception Survey is about to go live.

The first Nottingham children and young people's perception survey will open on World Children's Day, the 20th November 2024. The survey will be supported by practitioner toolkits, to help support children and young people take part, and communications messages to help partners spread the word.




Article 12 of the UNCRC says that every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered seriously.



The survey has been designed to be accessible to the widest possible audience. It is split into three age groups: Primary (7-11), Secondary (11-16), and Further Education & Training (16+). The different versions use language and questions appropriate to each cohort.

Meanwhile for the 0-7years, there will be fun, creative activities designed for use by teachers, early years practitioners and carers, to help capture the views and experiences of the young children they work with.

The CFN Perception Survey has been designed to complement other surveys taking place in Nottingham and build upon the base that we currently have. More information will be published soon on the Child Friendly Nottingham website (link and QR code at the bottom of the page).
